

MRW FOUNDATION GOES TO AFRICA


Gerry and I recently got back from our 2nd trip to Africa with World Vision. As many of you know, we travelled to Rwanda, Africa in 2019 with World Vision. There, we were introduced to the extreme needs of the Rwandan people. Clean water is the starting point in extreme poverty situations, so that was our main focus - to help get the people Rwanda clean water. Once a community or village has clean water, it can begin to thrive. From there you can see a "ripple effect". Because a community or village has clean water, the children can go to school. They aren't walking for hours a day to collect dirty water. Because of clean water, the people in these villages begin to feel better physically and are not sick all the time from drinking dirty water. Because of clean water, this community can can stay well and focus on productivity.... and the list goes on and on. Clean water is the beginning to a better future.

ter future. So our first stop in Africa back in June of this year was in Rwanda to celebrate!

We were able to meet up with a young girl named Esther that we met back in 2019 to see how well she is doing since her village received clean water. She goes to school now, still trying to catch up, but going regularly and doing well. She has clean clothes, clean skin and no more skin irritations and rashes from the dirty water. She's not sick all the time from drinking dirty water and Esther and her community are thriving.

We were also able to go to a village and celebrate the "turning on" of their new water point! What a wonderful

celebration it was! We were greeted by singing and dancing, everyone so happy that they now have clean water! And YOU are part of the reason they have it! It is because of YOUR hard work that the MRW Foundation can support World Vision everywhere they work, to bring everyone clean, safe drinking water!



Being in Rwanda was definitely the "easy" part of our journey. It gave us the chance to reflect and celebrate on how different and better life is and will continue to be for the Rwandan people.

The next stop was Zambia

where we learned of the extreme needs of these precious people. Our first stop, after riding about 3 hours on dirt roads (very bumpy I might add!), gave us a glimpse of such poverty that I will never forget. We met a couple, Allen and Kenita, and their 5 children. They had 6 children but one child passed away from being sick from drinking dirty water. Upon meeting this family the children were very lethargic, 2 or 3 of them had fevers. Their clothes were tattered, no shoes but they all smiled.







We learned that Kenita spends about 8 hours a day collecting dirty water for her family. She walks about a kilometer (.62 miles) to a hole that has been dug by the villagers. She took us to the pit and showed us how she collects the water. When she pulls the bucket up out of the pit, it looks like milk...so dirty! It is so sad because Kenita knows this water makes her and her family ill, but she also knows everyone must drink water to stay alive. Can you imagine having to make that decision every day? So we all took a bucket to carry back to her home. Each bucket weighs about 35-40 pounds, and she carries it on her head! I have to admit....I only made it halfway back to her home. One of our fellow travelers had to carry mine the rest of the way.

After getting back to her home, we had the chance to get to know more about their daily life and how hard it is for them. Neither Kenita nor her husband have much education so farming and woodworking are their livelihoods. Kenita clears out farmers' fields once they are harvested and Allen farms and makes stools and other things out of wood as well.

Their oldest child is the only one that goes to school, and can only go once or twice a week because he has to walk 7 kilometers to get there. We learned that during certain seasons, this family only has enough food to eat once a day. It was heartbreaking to hear of this daily struggle they face just to survive. However, before we left their village we were able to share great news....clean water is coming soon!! Can you imagine the emotion of hearing that great news?? It genuinely brought Kenita to tears of joy!! And the rest of us as well!

This is just a glimpse of all that we saw and experienced while in Zambia this time. Because of your hard work and so many others, World Vision is working to END extreme poverty! Stay tuned to hear more about World Vision in the next newsletter!
